How to Administer Teat Sealant

- After cleaning the teat with alcohol, firmly pinch and hold the base of the teat with one hand
- 2) With other hand, gently insert the tip of the tube into the teat end
- 3) Infuse the entire tube into the teat
- 4) DO NOT massage upwards into the udder

- Ask the most experienced employee to explain the pruning process to the group, showing them on branches that you've brought in for a demo.


